Chocolate Scrummy stuff, and loads of it lying around over Christmas....but please remember not for our pets. It contains 'theobromine', which is poisonous to dogs & cats, and can be fatal. So don't give in to those pleading eyes!

Baubles Bangles & Beads to decorate your tree, not the inside of your pet's tummy!

> Twinkly Lights usually require extra plugs and cables, so beware of pets chewing at wires etc., or Rover and Tiddles might just end up being part of the display!

Treats Too many and like us

humans, over indulgence can cause stomach upsets and unhealthy weight gain.

Turkey The carcass bones are a definite big NO! These could become lodged in their throat, intestine or stomach to cause big problems.

Pills lotions & potions You never know what visiting guests will leave around the house, so ensure all human medication is kept well out of reach from your pets, as some can prove fatal to animals.

Exercise Keep up the daily dog walk, it's part of your pets' important routine healthcare.

Small pets living outside need plenty of warm bedding,

and check that drinking water is not frozen.

Antifreeze Great for our cars, but potentially fatal for animals if swallowed. Clear spillages, and call us immediately if you think your pet has ingested this liquid.
